Re: County of Peterborough Sign By-law No. 2007-55

The County of Peterborough is currently reviewing Sign By-law No. 2007-55 which regulates the placement of signs or other advertising devices on and within 400 meters of County roadways.

The installation of third-party advertising signs (Bush Country Signs) is permitted under the current By-law and the continued installation of these signs is of particular interest to County Council.

We hope to gather feedback from County residents and businesses to assist with the By-law review process.

Alternatives to third-party advertising signage, such as Tourism-Oriented Directional Signing (TODS), will be considered as a component the By-law review.

There is currently a moratorium on the installation of new Bush Country Signs during this review period.
